RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B, or else registration or transfer of registration must have been applied for. The registration number/ authority to compete (ATC) number will be required for each entry.
2. All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete (ATC) number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without a Kennel Club Registration number or an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
3. Entry fees are £3 per class, £5 for pairs. Working BCDTC members 4 free runs per day.
4. No prize money is offered at this show.
5. Online and postal entries are available – see front of schedule for full details
6. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
7. Only dogs of 18 calendar months of age and over on the day of competition are eligible for competition at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows.
8. A dog must not compete in the same class more than once, including special classes.
9. No capping levels have been set for any classes.
10. Not for Competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
11. No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
12. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the competitions is forbidden.
13. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
14. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under test. A flat, close fitting, leather or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar i.e. not attached by a ring.
15. Should a judge be unable to fulfill the appointment to judge the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
16. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
17. Sponsors of the show: full details are listed on the final page of the schedule. Christine Mitchinson Catering. Dog Vegas qualifier sponsored by First Place Processing – online processing specialists. The Kennel Club Olympia Agility Stakes sponsored by Skinners
18. Kennel Club Standard marking Regulations apply for all standard classes.
19. The height of hurdles, dog walk and A-frame, and length of dog walk will be as per kennel club regulations. The hurdles for any size & veteran dog classes will be held on small heights (35cm) for large and medium dogs. Micro size 25cm for small dogs. The Dog Walk and A frame will be full height.
20. The Height limit for dogs.
 - a) Large Dogs - For dogs measuring over 430mm (1ft 5ins) at the withers.
 - b) Medium Dogs - For dogs measuring over 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) and measuring 430mm (1ft 5ins) or under at the withers.
 - c) Small Dogs - For dogs measuring 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) or under at the withers.
21. Judges at an Agility Show may not enter for competition a dog which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership, or handle a dog at the Show at which they are judging. Dogs may be disqualified if proved to have been handled in the class by the scheduled judge's spouse or immediate family, or resident at the same address as the scheduled judge.
22. Removal of dogs from Competition:
Following discussion between the show management and/or a veterinary surgeon, a dog shall be prevented from competing and/or removed from the Show if it is:-
 - a. A bitch which is in season.
 - b. Suffering from any infectious diseases or contagious disease.
 - c. Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
 - d. Of such temperament or is so much out of control as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
 - e. Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.The circumstances of such a removal shall be recorded in the competition/show Incident Book and submitted to the Kennel Club.
23. Dog Agility is a competitive and physically strenuous activity. It is the responsibility of the owner/handler to ensure their dog is 'fit for function' and that they themselves are fit to take part. By signing the entry form you confirm that to the best of your knowledge your dog is fit and able to take part in Agility classes on the day of the show.
24. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 25 days before the start of the competition, i.e. **20th June 2017**, shall be counted when entering for any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitor's responsibility to notify the show secretary at least 14 days before the date of the show. The dog will then be moved into the appropriate class(es) for the next grade. The dog must be moved into the corresponding number of classes as were entered at the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade the competitor will be offered a refund of the relevant entry fees.
25. Should circumstances so dictate the Society, in consultation with the Judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them will be reported to the Kennel Club.
26. In the event that the show is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, the society will refund fees, less reasonably incurred expenses. If the show processor has the provisions to do so, competitors will be refunded in the manner in which they had entered the show, but in any event the society will refund fees within 3 months of the show date to all those who had entered and requested a refund within 1 month of the show date.
27. Except for mobility aids, nothing shall be carried in the hand or while the dog is under test and food shall not be given to a dog whilst in the ring.
28. Should the judge deem a re-run is required, any result and/or faults gained in the previous run must be discounted.
29. Separate entry forms must be completed by each owner and must be signed by the owner or his authorised agent in accordance with provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied by the appropriate fees.
30. Free Passes – not applicable
31. Competition of Dogs Suffering from Contagious or Infectious Disease – No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the Competition may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A11.
32. It is the competitor's responsibility to be available for their class and running order. Competitors must run as close to their running order as possible. Failure to do so may be reported to the Kennel Club.
33. Animals in Event - No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee. However, at the discretion of the show society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
34. Pay on the day ring – not applicable
35. A practice ring may be available to dogs entered for competition at the show, if space allows. This ring must be supervised by a responsible adult with agility knowledge.
36. Welfare of Dogs
An exhibitor (or competitor) whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this Regulation may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

THE KENNEL CLUB OLYMPIA AGILITY STAKES

RULES 2017

All events must be judged under the appropriate Kennel Club Regulations H & H(1) in force at the time of the event. Competitors entering any competition will be deemed to have agreed to abide by these rules.

All heats must take place at Kennel Club licensed shows and the class name in the schedule should replicate exactly the name of the competition as stated in these rules.

All Kennel Club supported competitions must be judged using standard marking.

If the entry for the heat exceeds 360 the class must be split into two equal parts. If the entry exceeds 540 the class must be split into three equal parts. No part, if split, may be less than 150 dogs. Rosettes and awards remain unchanged if the heat is split and will be given for each part.

Dogs entered in any heats must be eligible for the competition entered and judges retain the right to check the height of any dog or ask to see the height stated in the Kennel Club Record Book.

The handler that qualifies a dog for the Quarter-Final / Semi-Final / Final will be the handler that competes, handler substitutions are not allowed.

Dogs cannot compete in more than one competition at Olympia. If a dog qualifies for more than one Quarter-Final or Semi-Final at the Kennel Club International Agility Festival the first successful qualification will take precedence and the dog will be withdrawn from any further Quarter / Semi-Finals and replaced by a reserve.

All winners of the Olympia Grand Finals will be invited to compete in the following year's Quarter-Final or Semi-Final at the International Agility Festival without qualifying through the usual procedure via heats. For the Novice winner this will be dependant on the dog still being eligible for grades 3 – 5 on the date of entries closing for the Kennel Club International Agility Festival

(These rules would be amended if any changes are made to Kennel Club Agility Regulations during the course of the competition year).

THE KENNEL CLUB OLYMPIA SMALL DOG AGILITY STAKES

Supported by Skinner's

This competition will be classified as Small Dog combined Grades 3 to 7 and judged under the Kennel Club Regulations for standard classes

Competitors may enter more than one dog in a heat. Competitors may qualify more than one dog for the Semi-Final, however only the competitor's highest placed dog at the Semi-Final will qualify for the Olympia Grand Final.

Once a dog has qualified for the Semi-Final / Final, further heats may be entered for competition although any placings in these further heats will not affect the dog's eligibility for the Semi-Final / Finals.

Those dogs eligible to compete in competition for Small Dog Agility are those measuring 350 mm (1 foot 1¼ inches) or under at the withers.

The first three previously unqualified placed dogs from each heat will go forward to the Semi-Final at the Kennel Club International Agility Festival held annually in August, the first ten dogs from this Semi-Final will qualify for the Final at the London Olympia Christmas International Horse Show (subject to the above).

QUARTER / SEMI FINALISTS NOTE:

All Quarter-Finalists / Semi-Finalists at the Kennel Club International Agility Festival will need to complete an official Festival entry form if the dog has not been entered in the show.

BCDTC Rules

37. All dogs are entered at their owner's risk and while every care will be taken, BCDTC will not accept responsibility for the loss, damage or injury to persons, dogs or property.
38. All campers must carry fire-fighting equipment.
39. This is a working farm; please keep out of the farm and away from all livestock. Please exercise dogs in marked areas, and have regard for other dogs and their owners. Please clean up after your dog and leave no litter.
40. Right to Refuse Entries. Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulation to refuse any entry.

WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.

ELIGIBILITY AND SCHEDULE OF CLASSES

In the following definitions of classes First Prizes or other prize wins are those gained in standard classes at any Kennel Club licensed Championship Agility, Premier Agility, Open Agility or Limited Agility Shows (i.e. special classes and invitational events excepted). Only a first place with a clear round completed within the course time set by the judge will count towards grade progression.

Standard classes may be scheduled for Agility Shows, as Agility classes or Jumping classes. All standard classes must contain the Weaving Poles obstacle. Standard Agility classes must contain the following elements: "A Ramp", Dog Walk and See-Saw. With this proviso classes are defined as follows:-

Class Structure - A Class may either be held as a Graded Class or a Combined Class. A Graded Class may be scheduled for one or more consecutive Grades with separate results and awards issued for each grade. A Combined Class may be scheduled for more than one consecutive grade with one overall set of results.

Lower Height Option.

Lower height option is only available to large dogs at this show. **A dog may only be entered at either the Full Height or at the Lower Height and cannot compete at a different height in any class at this competition, including special classes. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule.** Each relevant class will have two heights with a change part way through to higher/lower the jump heights and competitors must run at their entered height. **The lower height option will run first in all the relevant classes.** There will be only one course walking at the start of the class. Awards will be separate for full and lower height options – please see schedule of classes for full details of classes available as LHO. **Please note:** Dogs entered in LHO cannot enter pairs or juniors at this show.

Points Progression

At the handler's discretion a dog may progress up to Grade 4 by winning 100 points at each grade, using the Agility Warrant points scheme (Regulation K3.c refers), except that there is no requirement for a minimum number of agility points. If this method of progression is selected, the handler must ensure the Show Secretary signs the dog's Agility Record Book at the first show entered at the higher grade. There is no time limit on this progression, however once a dog has progressed, it cannot return to a previous grade.

Progression on points must be done prior to the closing date of entries. It is not possible to change a grade on points once the entries have closed.

STANDARD CLASSES

Only first prizes and points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes. (A dog is only eligible for one grade). In defining the eligibility of the owner or handler for Grade 1, the three jumping wins and points progression referred to in the definition apply only to one dog and not an accumulation of dogs.

Grade 1 (Elementary)

For owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows. N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 1, (Elementary) are not eligible for this class.

Grade 2 (Starters)

Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grades 1, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, or elected to progress on points from Grade 1. N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 2 (Starters) are not eligible for this class.

Grade 3 (Graduate)

Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or 2 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and dogs which are not eligible for Grade 4, 5, 6 or 7.

Grade 4 (Novice)

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 3 or elected to progress on points from Grade 3 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 5, 6 or 7.

Grade 5 (Intermediate)

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 4 and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 6 or 7.

Grade 6 (Senior)

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of 3 first places at Grade 5 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, one of which must have been gained in an Agility (not Jumping) Class, and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 5 or 7.

Grade 7 (Advanced)

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of 4 first places at Grade 6 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, 2 first places must be gained in Agility (not Jumping) Classes.

SPECIAL CLASSES

Wins, places and clear rounds in special classes will not count towards agility warrant points or grade progression at Kennel Club shows.

Veteran Dogs (special) –for all sizes of dogs over 10 years old, (over 8 years for ABC), at 15th July, (16th July for Sunday entries).

These classes will jumping and agility over hurdles measuring 35 cm for large and medium dogs and 25cm for small dogs, and will not contain any weaves or tyre. Agility classes will not contain the seesaw. The dog walk and A frame will be full height. Any dogs entered in these classes are not eligible to be entered into any other class at this show, except another veteran class.

Any Size Dogs (special) – These classes will be jumping and agility over hurdles measuring 35 cm for large and medium dogs and 25cm for small dogs, and will not contain any weaves or tyre. Agility classes will not contain the seesaw. The dog walk and A frame will be full height. This class is open to any dog over the age of 18months. Any dogs entered in these classes are not eligible to be entered into any other class at this show, except another anysize class.

Special junior classes – open to competitors under 18 years at 15th July 2017 (16th July for Sunday competitors).

Saturdays junior class will be split with separate awards according to the grade of the dog. Combined grades 1-4 and 5-7.

Sunday junior classes there will be two age groups with separate awards. **C64** for juniors up to but not including their 12th birthday, and **C65**, for those juniors from their 12th birthday up to but not including their 18th birthday on the day of competition. Juniors may enter a maximum of 3 dogs in total each day. Open to all sizes of dogs -

Open Pairs (special)–class29 - open to large dogs only. **If you need us to try and find you a partner please indicate this on your entry form.**

Small and medium Lucky dip pairs jumping (special) – class 8– You **DO NOT** need a partner for this class. You will be allocated a partner in a random draw. All fences will be set at 35cm.

Special Time Fault and out - JUMPING Classes 41, 48 and 63 - Jumping

SPECIAL TIME FAULT & OUT

A standard Jumping course, with a set course time, the winner will be the person who has completed the most obstacles clear within the course time. When the course time has been reached, or if you should fault at any point within the course time, a whistle will sound & you should make your way as fast as possible to the finish section of the course. If any obstacle is taken on the way to this finish it will not be included in the total of obstacles completed. If the dog completes the course before the course time is reached the dog continues round the course again. The highest number of obstacles taken will determine the winner. In the event of a tie the fastest time will determine the winner.

There will be LHO available for class 63 which is the time, fault and out for large dogs.**

Large Dogs Combined Agility Grades 1, 2 & 3 Competition Rules

The “**Dog Vegas Qualifier**” is a competition for Large dogs, eligible for Grades 1, 2 & 3.

There will be approximately ten qualifying heats. The top 5 dogs from each heat (top 3 if the heat is split into 2 parts), will qualify for the **The Dog Vegas Final** comprising of approx 50 dogs at the July Dog Vegas show in 2018.

At the final, prize money of £250 will be awarded between the top 5 places dogs & handlers, 1st- £100, 2nd-£70, 3rd-£50, 4th-£20, 5th-£10. The winner will also receive a trophy & money off vouchers for future Dog Vegas shows.

1. **Jump heights will be set at 650mm standard heights only for the qualifier.**
2. This class must be judged under the appropriate Kennel Club Rules in force at the time of the competition
3. If the entry for a heat exceeds the KC limit for a judge in a day then the class will be equally and randomly split and another judge appointed for the second part
4. All competitors entering the class will be deemed to have agreed to abide by the rules of the Kennel Club and the specific regulations governing this class.
5. The competition is open to Kennel Club registered dogs eligible to compete at Large Height Grade 1, 2 & 3.
6. Handlers may enter more than one dog in the competition and may qualify more than one dog for the final event.
7. Once a dog has qualified for the final it may enter further heats, as long as it is still eligible for Grade 1, 2 or 3.
8. Handlers who have already qualified their dog for the final must report this fact to the appropriate Show Secretary before running in the class. If the already qualified dog then qualifies again, the place will be awarded to the highest placed unqualified dog.
9. The first five dogs from the heat will be invited to compete in the final. The next five dogs will be held as reserves.
10. If the class is split the top three dogs from each part will be invited to compete in the final. The next top three in each part will be held as reserves.
11. In the event of a dog being unable to compete in the final due to unavailability, illness or injury the reserves from that heat will be called up in numerical order.
12. In the event of a handler being unable to compete in a final due to illness or injury a substitute handler for the qualifying dog will be allowed to run the dog.

There will be a lower height option for this class at Barnard Castle show, however any dog competing at the lower height option will not be eligible to qualify for the finals.

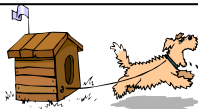
